EPA Thriving Communities for Environmental Justice Grantmaking

Philanthropy Northwest is serving as a pass-through organization for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Thriving Communities for Environmental Justice Grantmaking Program, which will provide \$40 million for assessment, planning, and development projects in Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington over the next three years. While there is no limit on the number of applicants from a single organization, an organization may only receive one program grant. The first application deadline is **December 15**, **2024.** A webinar about this opportunity is scheduled for October 9, 2024, at noon. Registration is required.

Its current activities include support for the American Tapestry Initiative with its goals of Strengthening Democracy, Advancing Equity for All, and Confronting the Climate Crisis, Humanities Perspectives on Artificial Intelligence, federal and international partnerships, and a new "applicant" experience. The <u>W. M. Keck Foundation Research Program</u> supports high-risk, high-reward STEM research that is not likely to be supported by traditional funding agencies (e.g., NIH, NSF, DOD). Applications to this foundation must be institutionally coordinated. Faculty interested in applying to this program should submit a <u>one-page concept</u> <u>paper</u> conforming to Keck's guidelines to <u>Foundation Relations</u> by **November 1, 2024**, by 5 p.m. for internal consideration.
